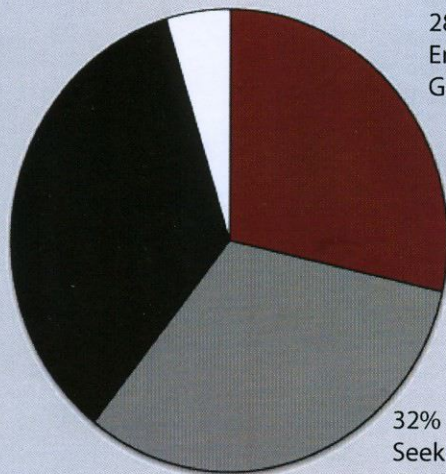


Post-Graduation Intentions
